MARIA YATSKOVA - DIRECTOR

Maria Yatskova was born in Moscow in 1976 and immigrated to the United States with her mother and grandmother five years later. She studied journalism in France and Belgium and graduated with a B.A. in Film Studies from the New School for Social Research in New York. Maria's engagement with Russian history began with her feature essay for the AP surrounding the controversial remains of Russia's last Czar, which appeared in the LA Times.

Her article about prison camp UF 91/9 in Siberia, titled "Crime and Beauty," appeared in the September 2006 issue of Marie-Claire magazine, and provides part of the vision behind her directorial debut, Miss GULAG, an official selection of the Berlin Film Festival. Winner of grants from the Ford and Sundance Foundations, Miss GULAG has been to over twenty international film festivals and was recently broadcast by the BBC. Currently, Maria is in Baku, Azerbaijan, at work on a film about Mstislav Rostropovich.
